Adopted first by California in 2011, the Seal of Biliteracy is now recognized in 31 states and Washington D.C. According to the official website, "the Seal of Biliteracy encourages students to pursue biliteracy, honors the skills our students attain, and can be evidence of skills that are attractive to future employers and college admissions offices." Since the 2017 pilot year in Arkansas a total of **346** students have attained certification, and this application season has seen the highest number of recipients.

The Arkansas Seal of Biliteracy is awarded each spring and fall to students in grades 9 through 12, and is sponsored by the Arkansas Foreign Language Teachers Association (AFLTA) and the Arkansas Teachers of English to Speakers of Other Languages (ARKTESOL).
